OUR MISSION

Our mission is to provide programs, classes, coaching and connections that transform, empower and equip individuals with the mindset, skills and habits needed to facilitate their financial self-sufficiency and personal, family and community well-being.

We offered the Enterprise RESTART Program to families, incarcerated and homeless individuals in Modesto and Patterson, CA.

The Enterprise RESTART program is at the core of our transformational programs and interventions — whether taught and facilitated as external classes two or three times per week or as part of the clean and sober transitional program offered at the Patterson site. We are encouraged by the steady 70% success rate we experience with each of the cohorts we serve.

HIGH SCHOOL EQUIVALENCY CLASSES AND CERTIFICATION



We help farm workers and their families study for and obtain high school equivalency certifications thanks to a federal grant received from the Department of Education.

Partnerships with the Housing Authority, school districts and Self-Help, LLC allow us to use their community-based facilities to serve our students close to their homes.

Many of our students are stay-at-home mothers who want to model for their kids the importance of education and commitment to hard work to achieve one's goals. Ninety-five percent of our graduates sign up for ESL classes following their graduation, many receive promotions within their work environments and a few seek and obtain employment that betters their lives. Some of our homeless RESTART program participants qualify for the program so we offer tutoring at HOST House as well.

The age span of our High School Equivalency program students varies between 18 and 65 and due to the low educational preparation that some of our students start the program with, it may take them 2 years to complete the courses. Some individuals, however, already have a solid educational background and even degrees in their countries of birth so they complete the classes in just a few months.

"This program has given me the opportunity of a lifetime. It has helped me to know myself better and learn that with effort and dedication everything can be achieved.

Obtaining my GED gives me the opportunity to get a better job and to continue improving my education. I thank my family for the great support they have given me in this decision to go to school. I am very grateful to God, my husband and my daughters, for their support.




Enterprise RESTART participants learn work skills and ethics, volunteer on a weekly basis as well as clean parks, alleys and city streets. They also learn entrepreneurial skills which help them develop a small service business.

"I have been homeless for many years and I've been to many shelters in this county, in others and in other states. This place is different. You are not processed as a number or as another dirty homeless that comes to spend the night. People here listen to you, talk to you, try to understand your situation and make you feel like a human being. I'm starting to have hope. City- and County-Wide Fundraising Campaign to Open the First Women's Shelter in Patterson There are approximately 25 women experiencing homelessness in the City of Patterson - *many with children*. Most women live at the "Cages" (pictured on the left).

Naomi's House was designed to house both female night guests and also offer a clean and sober transitional living environment for 15 women who want to transform their lives and reconnect with their families, become better mothers and work toward financial self-sufficiency.




Total Unrestricted Net Assets
